

The owner of this young donkey brought him as he was unable to stand up. The young donkey was diagnosed with spinal trauma, which affected his ability to use his hind limbs. With pain relief, vitamins, a course of steroids and regular visits to help him get up and walk he is now fit and well, able to stand on his own and walk normally with no pain. He is getting stronger every day and is now ready to go home. He has been a real favourite during my time at ACE."



Here at ACE we would like to purchase an


Electrosurgery unit

Please assist us if you can by donating towards the cost. Thank you for your caring support.





This feisty stallion has been in a fight over a mare that was in season. Rambo came off the worst! He was badly bitten - the wound extends to both sides of his neck. Most of the stallions here are ungelded due to cultural reasons.



This lovely donkey is hospitalised with a wound on her right front leg. Her foal is of course staying with her as the babe needs 24 hour access to the milk bar!



"For Kathy Staly and me our month-long trip to Egypt has been among our most gratifying and productive. Every day we reported to work at ACE feeling joy being with the staff who make life better for Luxor's animals and people in need.

During our visit in 2020 we were invited to join the ACE Team. This time we were welcomed to the ACE Family. ACE is the ideal animal charity for us to support. Kathy has always been an animal advocate because animals are unable to advocate for themselves. The mission of ACE aligns perfectly with Kathy's vision.

We had no expectation of major impacts on ACE but planned to continue our usual low-key activities. Discussions provided opportunities to advance our shared priorities there; this includes my avocation of fixing and building things.

Donations to ACE are used for the day-to-day running of the hospital, including paying salaries, utilities, animal feed, medicine, supplies, fuel, rubbish disposal etc. Any extra funds would be allocated for repair and maintenance of the facilities but was never sufficient to cover the needs.

I had worked on small projects at ACE five years ago and could see the results were still effective. However, more needed to be done. With the team we identified needs for repair and upgrading. Estimates for costs were produced and Kathy and I immediately accepted responsibility for payment.

ACE will be our focus for charity contributions going forward.
Observing how effectively ACE is meeting its goals with the dedicated service of support staff, being welcomed as volunteers to help as we are and participating in the daily life of Egyptians in Luxor, offers rewards that far exceed the value of donations we make."
